WHAT IS A LEVEL II OR III RECOVERY RESIDENCE?

While all recovery residences have their own culture, Level III homes (also known as Supervised Recovery Residences) are typically best for individuals transitioning from a rehabilitation or inpatient treatment facility.

The National Association of Recovery Residences (NARR) classifies Level III homes as having:

- Organizational hierarchy
- Policies and procedures
- Emphasis on life skills development
- Clinical services utilized outside of the residence
- A facility manager
- Certified staff or case managers

Level II homes (Monitored Recovery Residences) are similar to Level III homes with slightly fewer services and staff.

ELIGIBILITY

- At least 18 years old
- Use MAT as part of recovery from opioid use disorder
- Ability to pay for MAT
- Genuine commitment to using MAT as part of recovery

STUDY BENEFITS

Once screened, individuals may qualify for:

- Housing from one of our community partners operating Level II or III recovery residences
- Compensation for completing surveys and interviews
- Access to additional resources to aid in their recovery journey
